Note from the Pastor

"I will be found by you," declares the Lord, "and will bring you back from captivity. I will gather you from all the nations and places where I have banished you...and will bring you back to the place from which I carried you into exile." Jeremiah 29:14

Many of us are familiar with the beautiful promise in Jeremiah 29:11. "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." In its original context, this was a hopeful declaration in the midst of a dark time—words spoken to a people in exile who were longing to return home, to return to "normal." It is a promise that we have been clinging to throughout the last several months during our own time of "exile."

Safety Team

In early 2020, LUMC started a rollout of the church's Safety Plan. Then the pandemic hit and on-site services were stopped. Jump ahead 12 months, and as we started our Sunday morning re-opening, Pastor Alex has asked us to restart rollout of the safety plan. Our first step in this plan took place on April 11 when Rock City re-started. A safety monitor was on duty for the 11:00 Rock City service. Their role in this first phase of the rollout is to actively monitor activities in the education wing and in the narthex. Each of the Rock City teachers have a radio in their room, go-bags with emergency items as well as "action sheets" with instructions to follow for the teachers. Safety Monitors also have the radio and "action sheet" instructions. The safety monitor is on duty to assure the safety of the children and teachers.
